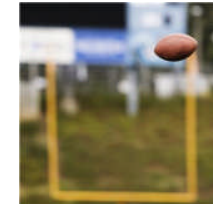

TRIP DETAILS:

Wednesday, August 29, 2012 – Niles or South Bend - Board motor coach in Niles and South Bend bound for Chicago O'Hare where you will board your overnight flight for Ireland. Dinner is served in flight.

Thursday, August 30, 2012 – Dublin - Upon arrival in Dublin you will be transferred to your hotel. You'll have the afternoon at leisure. Tonight you will enjoy a welcome dinner at your hotel.

Friday, August 31, 2012 – Dublin – After breakfast you will join your guide for a walking tour of Dublin. You'll see the former armoury of the Bank of Ireland and the courtyard of the old Parliament House. Next, you'll visit the former House of Lords, then enter the hallowed gateway of Trinity College, passing through its elegant 18th and 19th century courtyards and greens. Hear some of its fascinating history, as well as an occasional tall tale associated with the university. Leaving the campus, stroll through the halls of the National Gallery of Ireland and into a district of splendid Georgian squares, long terraces, tranquil parks and government institutions. Beautiful Merrion Square Park will reveal many surprises, not least the remarkable statue to Oscar Wilde. Relax over lunch (included) in the atmospheric cellars of the Duke of Wellington's birthplace. The balance of the day is at leisure. Dinner on your own.

Saturday, September 1, 2012 – Dublin – GAME DAY!!! After breakfast you'll be transferred to Aviva Stadium for the Notre Dame vs. Navy game. Enjoy the game!!! A boxed lunch is included for the day. After the game you will be transferred back to your hotel. Dinner on your own.

Sunday, September 2, 2012- Dublin/Cork – After breakfast your first stop of the morning will be at Jim Tynan's Kitchen and Foodhall. Enjoy morning tea or coffee and homemade scones in this award-winning, family-owned gem (included). Travel on to historic Cashel. The town's rich heritage is reflected in its prehistoric raths, medieval monasteries, fortified townhouses, a Georgian Cathedral and a 21st-century library. The Georgian quarter also boasts the Bolton Library, where you can find the smallest book in Ireland. There is some free time to explore the town and visit the iconic Rock of Cashel. You'll also visit the city of Waterford before continuing to your hotel in Cork. Lunch is on your own, dinner tonight will be at your hotel (included.)

Monday, September 3, 2012 – Cork/Killarney – After breakfast visit Cork City and the English Market, one of the oldest of its kind, trading as a market since 1788. In the old days, stalls sold local foodstuffs, and most of the shoppers haggled with the stall owners in hopes of even better deals. Give it a try, if you feel up to the challenge! Nibble on a specialty cake and morning coffee (included) before heading to the Heritage Centre in Cobh. This is the place from which most emigrants departed when they set sail for America. The "Queenstown Story" is a fine exhibition of the history of these departures. Queenstown, as Cobh was once called, was also the Titanic's last port of call before she sank on her maiden voyage. Then travel on to the lively town of Killarney and your hotel. Dinner at the hotel (included).

Tuesday, September 4, 2012 - Killarney – After breakfast you have your choice of activity. You might want to go on a guided horseback ride through Killarney National Park. The trails will take you along the north of Lough Lein for views of Ross Castle, Ross Island, Innisfallen Island and the surrounding mountains. Or, board a traditional jaunting car and ramble along the same route with a local jarvey. The balance of the day is leisure to relax at your hotel. Perhaps pay a round of golf or stroll along the lakes. This evening, share the adventures of the day over dinner (included) and traditional Irish entertainment at Kate Kearney's Cottage. Lunch is on your own.

Wednesday, September 5, 2012 – Ring of Kerry – After breakfast, you'll travel the road that winds around the beautiful Iveragh Peninsula, better known as the "The Ring of Kerry." Here mountains, valleys, lakes and sea blend into a landscape that is often breathtaking beyond words. Stop for lunch (included) at award winning QC's Seafood Bar & Restaurant in the town of Cahirciveen. This is a terrific Irish pub and seafood restaurant run by the Cooke family. Both the restaurant and the family fish shop are stocked daily with fresh fish from the family's boats. Dinner on your own.

Thursday, September 6, 2012 – Killarney/Dromoland Castle – After breakfast, you'll explore Crag Cave, an underground wonderland with limestone stalagmites and stalactites. Discovered in 1983 and thought to be over a million years old, this natural attraction was built up with pathways and dramatic sound and lighting effects for an unforgettable "cave show." Next visit the Flying Boat Museum at Foynes. It celebrates the golden age of aviation, when this small town on the Shannon River was the central hub for routes between Europe and North

America. Foynes is also the birthplace of Irish Coffee, and there is time to sample the warming beverage before continuing to Adare, Ireland's prettiest village. Then, a highlight, - Dromoland Castle. Dating from the 16th century, it is one of the most famous baronial castles in Ireland. It is one of the few castle hotels that can trace its ownership back through history to Gaelic Irish families of royal heritage. Dine in splendor tonight in the Earl of Thomond Restaurant (dress shirt required for men). Lunch is on your own, dinner is included.

Friday, September 7, 2012 – Shannon/Chicago/South Bend or Niles - After breakfast you'll be transferred to the airport for your return flight home. You will arrive back at Chicago O'Hare the same day where you will board your motor coach for the return trip to South Bend and Niles.
